PUBLIC PROCUREMENT



- Public procurement plays a vital role in the socio-economic development of a country.
- Transparent Public Procurement is quite essential for judicious utilization of the taxpayers' money. Lot of efforts has been made by the Government of India to enhance transparency in Public Procurement.
- Technology is widely used in bringing the transparency in governance.

Government E- Marketplace (GeM)
Government E-Procurement System (CPP)





- Government of India had launched an e-marketplace that aims to help all the government officials in purchasing goods and services that are of common use like air conditioning and heating equipment, writing instruments, water, projectors, desk and computer supplies and services like security, human resources, house-keeping, among others.
- At the moment, any ministry or department can buy goods of upto Rs 50,000 directly off the portal. (Ref GFR 2017-Rule 149)
- For anything that costs beyond that, purchases have to be made through price comparison, bidding or reverse auction.





Who Are The Buyers

- Authorised representatives of Central Government Departments/ State Governments/ PSUs/ Autonomous bodies can utilize the GeM.
- DGS&D authorises officers of the rank of Joint Secretary and equivalent for using the services of GeM.
- These officers can further authorise other officers of their Department to utilize the services of GeM.





Primary User

Authorized officers of the rank of Deputy Secretary/Equivalent or Head of the Office at Sub Center / Unit / Branch of Government Organisation / PSU / Autonomous Bodies / Local Bodies / Constitution Bodies / Statuary Bodies can register as Primary User on GeM.

Role of HoD/Primary User in GeM is to create Secondary users for his organization i.e. Buyer, consignee, DDO/ Paying Authority. He can add secondary users after clicking on Manage Users tab after logging in the GeM portal. HoD/Primary User cannot perform Buying functions on the portal.



Four types of roles are performed by Secondary users in GeM portal

Buyer: Buyer will select the item for purchase and will place the order on behalf of his organization.

Digital India

Consignee: Consignee will receive the item and will generate the PRC and CRAC certificate.

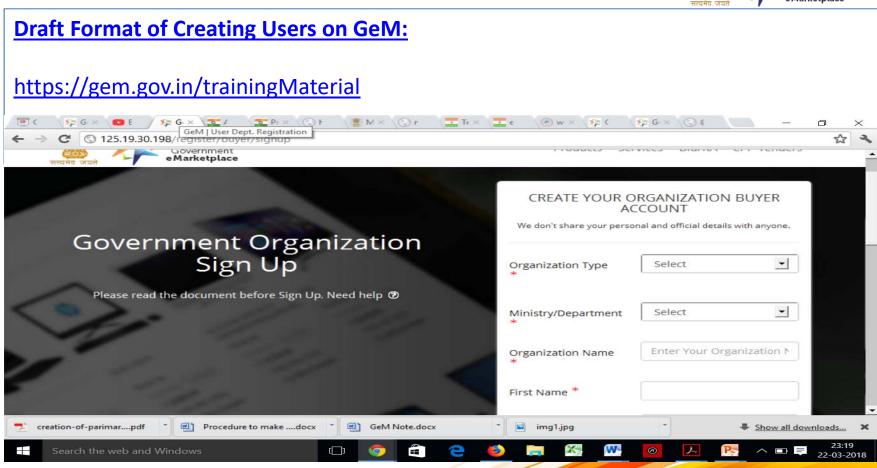
DDO (only for PFMS payment mode users): DDO will forward the bill to PAO of PFMS. (NOTE:-In case of PFMS payment method, there is no role of Paying Authority / PAO in GeM. PAO from PFMS just needs to login to PFMS portal to make the payment after the bill has been forwarded by DDO to PFMS portal.

PAO from PFMS can see and verify on-line the various documents related to the procurement before making payment.)

Paying Authority / PAO (for other than PFMS payment mode users): Paying Authority / PAO will make the payment to supplier/vendor.

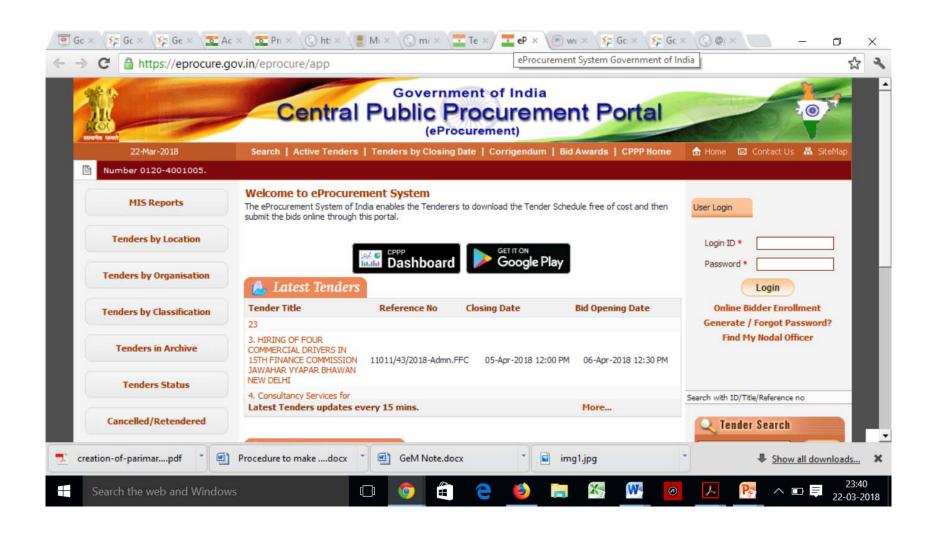


Government E-Procurement System (CPP)



- The Central Public Procurement Portal (https://eprocure.gov.in/eprocure) is launched by NIC on behalf of Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance, and Government of India.
- It is known as Government e-Procurement System of NIC (GePNIC).
- This is generic software which can be used by the Central Government Departments and Organizations.
- All kinds of procurement activities such as goods, works and services
- can be processed on through this portal

Background of CPP institutions in India

- Defined by the Principles of General Financial Rules(GFR) of the Government of India
- Process Guidelines enforced by Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) to ensure that free and fair procurement process is in place
- eProcurement Initiated from— Govt of Andhra Pradesh (2003), Indian Railways (2005), Govt of Karnataka (2004), National Informatics Centre, Meity (2008).
- Procurement is one area where large percentage of money is spent across Central / State Government.

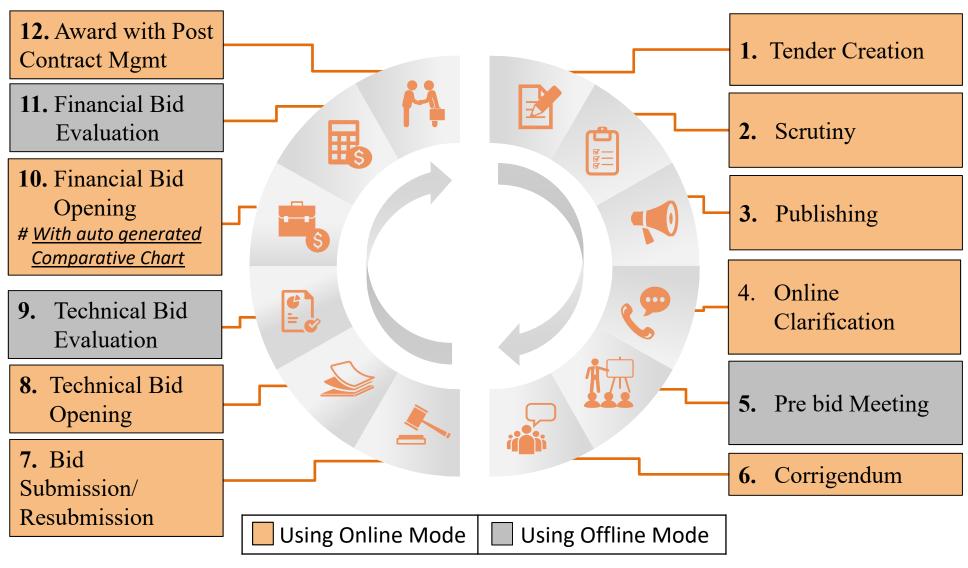

RFI

Request For Information

- Purchaser does not have sufficient information to write a detailed request
- Purchaser is not necessarily committed to buying
- Likely to involve a further request before a final decision.

EOI / ROI

Request For Information or Registration Of Interest

- Similar to an RFI
- Often used as a screening or shortlisting tool
- Purchaser is not necessarily committed to buying
- Likely to involve a further request before a final decision.

RFP / RFO

Request For Proposal or Request For Offer

- Purchaser seeks solutions-based submissions to meet their needs
- Possibly no clear specification
- Greater flexibility than an RFT
- Suited to professional services.

Request For Tender

RFQ

Request For Quotation

- Purchaser has clearly defined criteria or specification
- Judged on both price and qualitative factors
- Purchaser is committed to buying.

- Purchaser has clearly defined criteria or specification
- Judged primarily or solely on price
- Purchaser is committed to buying.

RFP-Request For Proposal

- An RFP is used where the request requires technical expertise, specialized capability, or where the product or service being requested does not yet exist, and the proposal may require research and development to create whatever is being requested.
- The RFP presents preliminary requirements for the commodity or service, and may dictate to varying degrees the exact structure and format of the supplier's response. Effective RFPs typically reflect the strategy and short/long-term business objectives, providing detailed insight upon which suppliers will be able to offer a matching perspective

Model RFP Template and Guidance Notes for e-Gov projects
